Key Responsibilities

- Carry out research to identify, understand and foster the mechanisms by which gender transformational research in AAS can be effective
- Assist in the design, implementation and reporting of WorldFish's investment in gender, including issues related to gender equality, empowerment, targeting, and social inclusion
- Strengthening the capacity of WorldFish and its partners to mainstream gender in our work
- Facilitate the exchange of knowledge on, and out scaling of, good practice approaches in the areas of gender equality, empowerment and social inclusion, and pro-poor targeting
- Use excellent qualitative or quantitative analysis skills to monitor and analyze the gender mainstreaming processes during program design and implementation
- Research publications and other communications

- Experienced in guiding surveys to collect and analyze primary data
